Rosecrance Prevention and Early Intervention Program

The Rosecrance Prevention and Early Intervention Program is an evidence-based alcohol and drug education program (Too Good For Drugs and Violence) for families, schools, law enforcement, physicians, service providers, and judicial circuit courts in Chicagoland.

The program is designed to provide education, support, and direction to teens and their families who may be at risk of more serious involvement with alcohol and other drugs.

Who would benefit from the program?

Teens who have exhibited recent behavioral changes and their parents may benefit. Those changes may include one or more of the following:

- Increase in school disciplinary actions
- Lower-than-expected grades
- Decreased interest or participation in extracurricular activities
- Increased tardiness/absenteeism
- Less time at home, secrecy or evasiveness concerning whereabouts and activities
- Use or suspected use of alcohol or other drugs, including nicotine and smoking/vaping devices
- Dishonesty regarding use of alcohol or other drugs
- Signs of being under the influence of chemicals (odor on breath or clothing, altered speech, etc.)
- Noticeable change in friends over a short period of time

What are the components of the program?

The Prevention and Early Intervention Program is a nine-hour program for teens consisting of:

- A comprehensive assessment (required)
- Three class sessions (parents attend session three)
- Toxicology
- An individualized exit interview held with the student and parents

What information is provided in the program?

Participation in the Rosecrance Prevention and Early Intervention Program will increase awareness and understanding of the effects of adolescent drug and/or alcohol use and misuse on youth and their families.

Attendees will learn:

- Adolescent attitudes toward tobacco, alcohol and other drug use
 - Family communication skills
 - Trends and stages of teen drug and/or alcohol abuse
 - Characteristics of commonly used drugs
 - Stages of adolescent development
 - Ways to parent teens who are experimenting with alcohol/drugs

Registration

Youth (12 -18) and their families can register at the time of assessment or prior to the scheduled class.

Cost

The cost of program is \$150 per family. Cost includes professional instruction and educational materials provided during the sessions. Payment is due before completion of the last class.
